• Goal 2: (Strategic Priority #4)	
AMS will increase the number of teachers using CFA aligned	
with standards to monitor student progress, inform	
instruction, and improve teacher practices on a weekly basis from 50% in 2017 to 60% in 2018.	
as these goals were developed in direct correlation to the school improvement plan (CIP) and the CCRPI. School goals as follows: • Goal 1: (Strategic Priority #3) AMS will decrease the number of student absences of 6 or more days from a baseline of 20% in 2017 to 15% in 2018. • Goal 2: (Strategic Priority #4) AMS will increase the number of teachers using CFA aligned with standards to monitor student progress, inform instruction, and improve teacher practices on a weekly basis	

• Goal 3: (Strategic Priority #6)

AMS teachers will effectively use data within PLC to establish a culture of accountability that leads to improved student performance as measured by the CCRPI from 52.3% in 2017 to 62% in 2018.

With a focus on collaboration, learning, and results, groups considered the following questions:

- How do you currently use this time for planning?
- How do you ensure there are enough rigorous tasks embedded in learning?
- How do you currently ensure ALL students are engaged?

Each grade group was given time to work together to problem-solve around how to use time more efficiently and effectively to improve student outcomes. Each grade group was provided suggestions for next steps.

Suggestions included:

7th grade

- Use CFA data more consistently to effectively plan instruction
- Use pacing guides as "guides" to make sure students understand material before moving on
- Effectively use ELT (Extended Learning Time) to ensure skill set deficits are monitored for improvement
- Work to increase Lexile scores for struggling readers

6th grade

- Increase the use of CFA data to ensure more students are participating
- Determine if "skill or will" deficit before determining interventions
- Share best practices and instructional strategies that work
- Establish common instructional strategies to ensure students are engaged

8th grade

- Use CFA data consistently with all content area
- Use Think Cerca writing assessment as a baseline (with support from Ms. Thompson, Literacy Coach)
- Streamline collaborative planning time by using google-docs or similar platform to share information (with support from Ms. Thompson, Literacy Coach)
- Look at strategies for quality instructional practices to ensure students are adhering

to expectations

 Maximize time by using Connections provided assessments as framework for CFAs

Connections

- Support content areas teachers by implementing common instructional strategies for student engagement, writing process, etc
- Determine how to support content teachers by reinforcing student goals (i.e. Lexile)
- Determine additional areas of student support in order to align school efforts and improve student outcomes

During the debriefing with Dr. Ridley, he determined that a possible root cause was establishing a consistent school culture with all staff. There are new teachers, as well as, a shift in roles that may need to be address in order to maximize results for all students.

Next Steps

- Work with Dr. Ridley to determine next area of support (school culture)
- Ensure teachers understand the school's non-negotiables regarding culture
- Develop professional learning topics based on data results for an embedded model supported by Literacy Coach, Administration, Cano
- Meet with leadership team to review status of book study (Transforming School Culture) to support goals
- Provide additional professional learning for teachers to ensure a deeper understanding of our mission
