The principal asked me to observe classrooms and to meet with grade levels to share my reflections. While I did this on day two, I did not see the teachers working with student work, which I believe may be the reason it is not an embedded process (right now, it is more of a compliance issue rather than commitment).

Leadership/Guiding Coalition Discussion

I worked with the administration and state department on day one, putting together our 30-60-90 day plan.

Additionally, I had an opportunity to work with the coach as she worked with her teachers on data analysis and the literacy/writing connection.

Next Steps

If not already, I will be sharing the 30-60-90 day plan with the staff. In addition, I want to continue working with staff to identify the connection between what student data they have and how they are going to change their instruction to meet the individual needs of students. Although we have worked on this each time I am there, I do not see the connect yet so we will continue to work.

Next Steps

I'd like to review the commitment we have to the PLC process with the principal.

Additionally, I will meet again with K-2 and coach and continue the conversation (and I asked for evidence) of what is going on in classroom (structure), student data (from the latest unit) and their interventions planned.
