	many of the increases were significant:
	90% of the students that took the Algebra Coc secret developing or above. One
	EOC scored developing or above. One

student scored in the distinguished range. ELA and Science increase the number of students scoring in the distinguished range and decreased the number of students scoring in the beginning range. The number of students scoring grade level or higher on the Lexile measure has increased in all grade levels. • The STAR climate report should increase to a level three or four from a two this school year. Attendance rates should improve this school year. Since Dr. Ridley and Ms. Childers will be taking positions at other schools next year, the leadership team was able to celebrate accomplishments and commit to continuing this work for the upcoming year. Continued support in the areas of Mathematics, Literacy, and School Culture were identified as areas of support within the school PLC process.
